

Serengeti National Park



- safari 1

5 days safari to Serengeti National Park - plus Ngorongoro Crater, Tarangire and Lake Manyara National Parks - with start in Mwanza and drop off in Arusha (or opposite).

Serengeti National Park - Tanzania's first and most famous park is renowned for its wealth of leopard and lion. The vast reaches of the park are a hiding place for the endangered black rhino and provide a protected breeding ground for the vulnerable cheetah, alongside the Serengeti's thousands of other diverse species. Serengeti National Park is an UNESCO World Heritage site.

Day 1: We will meet you at your hotel in Mwanza and drive towards the Ndabaka Gate to Serengeti National Park about 135 km and a 2½ hours drive from Mwanza. It's a nice trip - you will have the beautiful Speke Bay on your left hand side most of the way and you will pass through nice small villages such as Kisesa, Nyanguge and Lamadi on the way to the western gate to the park. We will have our lunch soon after arrival somewhere in the park and then we'll take an afternoon game drive - before the dinner will be ready at Kati Kati Tented Camp - our stop in Serengeti for the first night.



Day 2: After an early breakfast, we will do another day of game drive in Serengeti. We will find a nice spot to relax and enjoy our lunchbox somewhere there. In the afternoon we will do en route game drive to Ngorongoro. Sundowner, dinner and overnight at Serengeti Heritage Camp.



Day 3: After breakfast we will carefully move down in the Ngorongoro Crater - a 250 km² wide and 600 m deep caldera. The crater alone has over 20.000 large animals including some of Tanzania's remaining black rhinos. Ngorongoro Crater is also an UNESCO World Heritage site. Dinner - and overnight after a drink or two at Ngorongoro Rhino Lodge.

Day 4: After an early breakfast we will drive to Lake Manyara National Park - which is one of Tanzania's smallest parks. Lake Manyara (the lake covers one third of the park) is famous for it's millions of flamingos in
